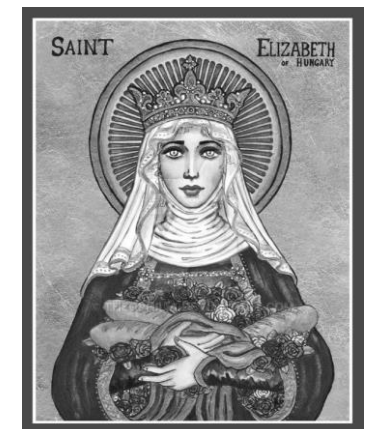


Wednesday – St Margaret of Scotland

She was born in Hungary of Anglo-Saxon and Hungarian parents. When William of Normandy conquered England she found refuge with King Malcolm III of Scotland, and they were married in 1070 and had eight children. She reformed the royal court, founded monasteries, and supported major reforms of Church life. She died in Edinburgh on 16 November 1093. She is remembered for the happiness of her marriage, for her devotion to prayer and learning, and especially for her generosity to the poor.

Thursday – St Elizabeth of Hungary

She was a daughter of the King of Hungary. She was given in marriage to Ludwig, the Landgrave of Thuringia, by whom she had three children. She frequently meditated on heavenly things and when her husband died she embraced poverty and built a hospice in which she cared for the sick herself.

Christmas Night Mass this year will be at **10 pm** in **Morar** but this will not happen every year. I have decided that Masses at Christmas will alternate every year between Arisaig/Morar/Mallaig. This means that next year Christmas Night Mass will be in Arisaig. I would also like to celebrate Christmas/Easter in Mingarry Parish. This Christmas, Fr Willy Slavin will supply in Mingarry over Christmas but it may happen next year that there will be a supply priest between Arisaig/Morar/Mallaig to allow me to go to Mingarry. I would appreciate your understanding in this matter and kindly ask for your help in preparing the Churches for Liturgies of Christmas this year.

ARISAIG PARISH:

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING: Thank you for your attendance and support at the meeting. The meeting was concerning the equipment placed on the tower of the church. HebNet thanks the parish community for hosting of

MASS TIMES: I know that Mass times on Sunday can be a bit confusing but until there is a resident priest in Mingarry, Mass times remain as agreed at the last Parish Council meeting. It might happen, just like next December, that additional services may be offered, but the regular Mass Times between Mingarry/Glenuig remain. I continually pray just like you for a priest to move in to Mingarry once again. Bishop McGee has informed me that he has asked two priests to come to Mingarry and both times the offers were rejected. At the same time I do not want you to feel neglected or forgotten by me. As a Parish Priest of Mingarry Parish I owe you gratitude for your help and support. I would also like to assure you that I do listen to your comments and am doing my best to provide you with the best possible pastoral care.
