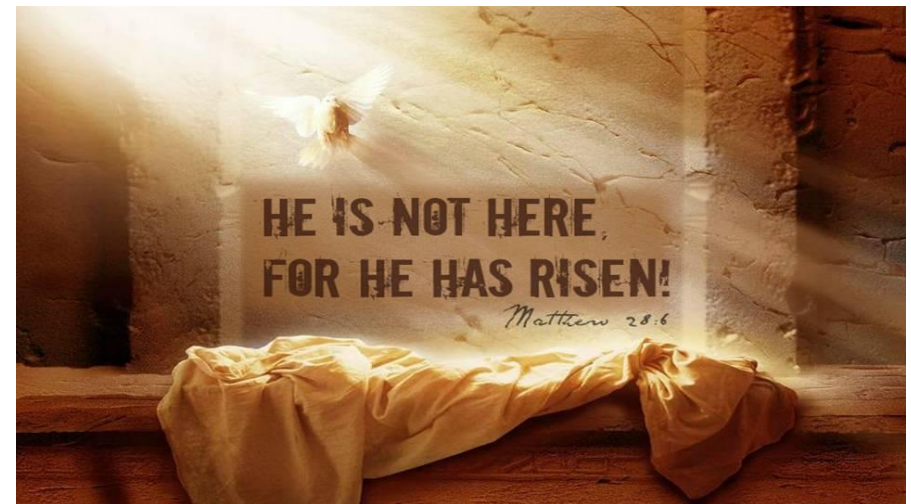

POPE FRANCIS AT GENRAL AUDIENCE BEFORE EASTER:

The Gospel message that Jesus died for our sins and rose to new life is a source of joy and hope for all the world. At the same time, it is a summons to our responsibility and mission as the Lord's followers to proclaim the victory of the Risen Jesus by our lives. In Baptism, we were given a share in Christ's passover from death to life. Each of us has been called to live fully this new life in union with him and in imitation of his loving concern for the least of our brothers and sisters. In the poor, the suffering, the

lonely and all those in need, we are asked to see the face of Jesus, and to become, in him, a means of redemption and hope, life and resurrection for our world. May Mary, who knew both the sufferings of the cross and the joy of the resurrection, obtain for us the grace to be united ever more fully to the Risen Lord and to reflect in our lives the reconciling and transforming power of his divine love.

NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE:

INCARDINATION [*In the Roman Catholic Church, incardination refers to the situation of a member of the clergy being placed under the jurisdiction of a particular bishop or other ecclesiastical superior. Its antonym, excardination, denotes that a member of the clergy has been freed from one jurisdiction and is transferred to another. Both terms are derived from the Latin cardo (pivot, socket, or hinge), from which the word cardinal is also derived—hence the Latin verbs incardinare (to hang on a hinge or fix) and excardinare (to unhinge or set free). The purpose of incardination is to ensure that no cleric, whether deacon or priest, is "freelance", without a clear ecclesiastical superior to whom he is responsible.*]: After twenty-two years working among us, Fr Noel Colford was incardinated into our diocese on Tuesday of last week. Fr Noel has faithfully witnessed to the Lord on Arran where he has built up the parish of the Holy Cross. We welcome Fr Noel as a full member of our Presbyterate. Bishop McGee thanked the Archdiocese of Glasgow for loaning Fr Noel to us for so long, and to Archbishop Tartaglia for permitting his incardination.

ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD OF REV EMMANUEL ALAGBAOSO: Bishop McGee will ordain Deacon Emmanuel to the priesthood in St Columba's Cathedral, Oban on **Thursday 21st June at 7pm**. Emmanuel will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving in the Cathedral on Friday 22nd June at 10am. All are welcome for these two Masses. Bishop McGee thank Emmanuel for offering his life to God and to our diocesan family. Emmanuel's ordination is a great occasion of rejoicing for the whole diocese.

ORDINATION TO THE DIACONATE OF RONALD CAMPBELL: Ronald will be ordained as a deacon in St Paul's Basilica, Rome on 13th June. We thank Ronald for offering his life to God and our local Church and, again, I ask for your prayers for him.
