FOOD BANK NEEDS OUR HELP: Please, continue with your generosity! The Trussell Trust, which runs 135 food banks across Scotland, said 6,551 parcels - with three days worth of food - were given to children in Scotland during the summer holidays last year. That's a 21% increase on the number of food parcels given out during the previous summer. Food banks help many children whose family can't always afford things. For those families, food banks are really helpful to make sure children and adults eat properly.
