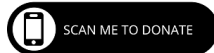

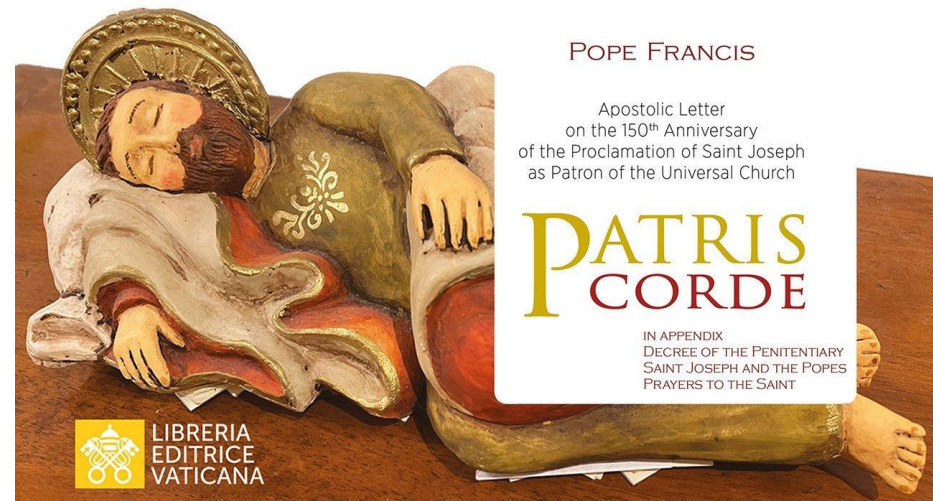

WE PRAY FOR THE SICK: There are a lot of people not well at the moment and require our constant prayers and support. I ask you to pray for my paternal aunt, Elzbieta.

Almighty and Eternal God, You are the everlasting health of those who believe in You. Hear us for Your sick servants for whom we implore the aid of Your tender mercy, that being restored to bodily health, they may give thanks to You in Your Church. Through Christ our Lord.

A thought from Fr Stan: Messages and emails continue to arrive via emails and other means to the Committee and the Parish. Most of the messages are a wonderful testimony of the importance of Faith in your lives and it is very moving to read them. There is obviously also a lot of upset and disappointment. Believe me that both me and the Parish share in this disappointment but perhaps it would be good to pass on these messages to your children, grandchildren, friends, family members. There is a lot of people of younger (not young!) generation that need to know how you feel. Do not be ashamed to speak about your Faith! Of course, we can start a debate and blame the institution, priest etc. for the reasons behind the decline in numbers. I think the main reason is foremost the fact that we do not talk about religion. We do not touch the subject at home less we upset our children who no longer attend. However, the thing is that rather than focusing on the blame, focus on the positive role that the Church and your Faith play in your life. Engage with them, do not avoid the subject. We hear so much these days about the necessity of discussing our emotions and problems. I think that a lot of them, if they read your messages, would look at you in a new light, perhaps open up to you about their own experiences, open their hearts to the message of the Gospel. Take the opportunity and share your positive thoughts about Religion and the Catholic Church with them. *'Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation.'*

EMERGENCY TRIP: I was so sad that my Father's Sister, who lives in Krakow, has taken ill and is currently in intensive care in the hospital. It is unrelated to Covid but because she does not have long to live and she is my God Mother, along with my Father we decided to see her on Monday. I will be travelling to Krakow via Amsterdam from Edinburgh on Monday morning and returning Tuesday morning. This means that Mass on Tuesday will be at St. Patrick's before the meeting at 6.30pm. I ask you to keep my aunt, Elzbieta, in your prayers. It is also her Birthday on Monday. I hope she will be conscious when I see her.
