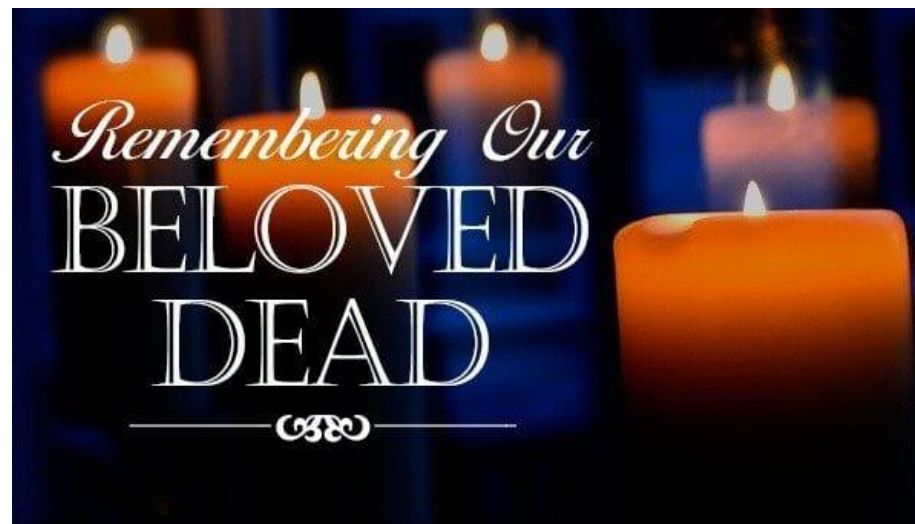

All Saints’ Day is a solemnity in the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven.

Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints --that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

Generally, All Saints' Day is a Catholic Holy Day of Obligation, meaning all Catholics are required to attend Mass on that day, unless they have a valid excuse, such as serious illness.

Tuesday – All the Faithful Departed

All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. The day is primarily celebrated in the Catholic Church, but it is also celebrated in the Eastern Orthodox Church and a few other denominations of Christianity. The Anglican church is the largest protestant church to celebrate the holy day.

ALL SAINTS: Solemnity is a Holy Day of Obligation in Scotland and celebrated on Monday, 1st November. There will be 2 Masses, 10am in Arisaig and 7pm in Morar. Mass for All Souls will be celebrated on Tuesday at 10am in Arisaig.

NOVEMBER: Envelopes for the November Dead List are available at the back. Put in the envelope the list with names of your deceased parents, relatives, all for whom you wish to pray. Return as soon as possible to the Chapel House (by post or in person through the letter box) or the Church on Saturday/Sunday. Names will be added on and read out during Sunday Masses in November like every year. Include your offering in the envelope. We will remember in particular those who died due to the pandemic.

REMEMBRANCE SERVICE: This year, I will lay a wreath at the Arisaig War Memorial on Sunday, 14th November at 9.30am. Please, join us if you can in the act of Prayer for those who offered their lives in service to us. Rev. Goudie will be joining us and has asked if he could coordinate the service this year.

SAVE ST. PATRICK'S COMMITTEE MEETING: Meeting will take place on Thursday in the West Highland Hotel. Many thanks to Sine for allowing us the use of the hotel. We will discuss some proposals. I will also present a report on the pledges. New Standing Orders have appeared in the Parish Bank which already started helping with the upkeep. Thank you. I need not to remind you that these pledges help the entire Parish to survive so includes all the Churches in the Parish which include St. Patrick's; St. Cumin's and St. Columba's. Making a pledge will help to keep all the Churches open.

STANDING ORDERS: It was brought up to my attention that some people had difficulties setting up Standing Orders at their Bank. The problem is related to the length of the name on the Parish Account. Quite often there are not enough fields to put it so the name prompts a message, which informs you about a problem with the name. You have to disregard the message and ask to proceed anyway. The full name of the Account is **RC Diocese of Argyll & the Isles – Morar Mission**. You have to make sure that the Sort Code **83-91-25** and Account Number are correct **65628087**. As long as these numbers are correctly set up, your money will land in the Parish Account. Pledges were made as an additional promise to your regular contributions. I would like to encourage you to make your regular contributions via Standing Order as well.

If you wish to make a Standing Order to Arisaig, the full name on the account is **RC Diocese of Argyll & the Isles – Arisaig Mission. Sort Code: 83-91-25 Account Number: 65626995.**

SOLEMN VESPERS FOR THE DEAD: After positive feedback from last year, I decided to hold a service on each Sunday in November at 5pm. It will take place in Morar on 7th and 21st November and 14th and 28th November in Arisaig. Texts will be available on the day and on the website in the Parish Newsletter section. Names will be read out as well.

ELECTRICAL TESTING: Chris Rice will be with us on Thursday, 4th November to continue with Certification for Morar. His next visits will be for St. Mary's, Kilmory and the Church Hall. The reason why they are so spread out is that we have to budget the costs. To cover the requirement for our Insurers, we need to carry out the full inspection every 5 years. It is up to the individual Parish Priest to organise it, there is no help provided from the Diocese. If the Priest chooses to disregard this requirement, it might void the insurance in the event of Fire.

FIRE ALARMS: The cost of adapting the Chapel House to new legislation in Scotland came up to £600.00 in the Chapel House in Morar. Arisaig came up to £527.96, but this includes Fr Campbell's Flat and the Club Room as the house is already partially compliant. Every home in Scotland must have interlinked fire alarms by February 2022. Interlinked means if one goes off, they all go off, so you will always hear an alarm wherever you are in your home. The new law has come about because of the Grenfell fire in London in 2017, and it applies to all Scottish homes. It is the property owner's responsibility for meeting the new standard.

What each home needs: By February 2022 every home must have: one smoke alarm in the living room or the room you use most; one smoke alarm in every hallway or landing; one heat alarm in the kitchen. All smoke and heat alarms should be mounted on the ceiling and be interlinked. If you have a carbon-fuelled appliance – like a boiler, fire, heater or flue – in any room, you must also have a carbon monoxide detector in that room, but this does not need to be linked to the fire alarms. Starting from February 2022. The Scottish Government is providing £500,000 to help eligible older and disabled homeowners with installation, in partnership with Care and Repair Scotland. We have wonderful support from our local electricians, including Alistair Neil MacKay, who can help you with installation and guidance.
