He will be staying at Kilmory. I am extremely grateful for his help. It is not easy to be a Bishop (or a Priest) in Scotland with a lot of pressure and responsibility. Please, keep Bishop Brian in your prayers.

ELECTRICIAN: Chris Rice was with us last Wednesday to make sure all the electricals are safe as part of our routine Health and Safety Maintenance.

MASS ON EIGG: It was a wet and cold crossing to Eigg last Thursday, but as people say – cold weather, but warm hearts! It was lovely to celebrate Mass of St Donnan on the island and see our parishioners.

GRASS IN MORAR AND MALLAIG: My thanks to Duncan and Michael for their help with grass cutting. With upcoming season, I am doing what I can

to help out in Morar with the grass but if we have a volunteer who would like to be part of the Rota on regular basis, it will assist me a lot. I usually do it once a week. Please speak to me if you can volunteer – so far no one else has volunteered.

PARKING: I know it is difficult to Park in Arisaig with the house car park reserved for guests. Believe me I am trying to find a solution and came up with 2 possible options:

1. We park one after another but if we could perhaps move cars further toward the garage so that more cars could fit in?
2. I have suggested before to use the available grass on the right-hand side from the school side. We could ask locally to get a digger and use gravel to harden it and lower the curb. It would allow for at least 8 cars to park there on an angle and allow easier access. Perhaps it is time to revisit the idea as before it did not win much consent?

I am open to any ideas you might have. Please remember that according to Health and Safety the fire engine needs access to possible flammable sources (oil tanks). We have 3 such tanks – behind the church, and 2 next to Kilmory. I know that the risk of such fire is not huge, and it never happened before, but I would not be able to forgive myself if something happened. Similar rule applies to Morar (access to the garage where the oil tank is located). There are 2 flowerpots that allow access and were donated by parishioners, but some people notoriously move the flowerpots to park and block access. Managing all the churches and properties is not easy and puts me under a lot of pressure. Please, I am always grateful for your understanding and all that you do for the Parishes.

CRAIGMYLE TRUST: Morar Parish has received a grant from the Trust. We are extremely grateful to Lord and Lady Craigmyle for their continuous support. I have filled in and applied for a grant from another Trust to help us cover the insurance bill.

GIFT AID: We received our rebate in Morar, which came to just over £7000.00 for last year. We are finalising our claim in Arisaig. Thank you so much for all your generosity toward the Parishes using Gift Aid envelopes.
