GRASS CUTTING: I am looking for volunteers for Morar and Arisaig. We are lucky with Duncan in Mallaig but if you want to give a hand as well, you can coordinate with him directly. If we decided to use a regular paid service, it would significantly affect our annual budgets. Season requires on average at least 25 cuttings and I am sure you know how expensive it can be for a small garden, whereas we have a much bigger area to cover. Thank you for your help!

STELLA CLARK RIP: I suppose the name would likely be unknown to a lot of you. Stella lived in Fochabers and during Covid became a regular participant in our livestream since due to her age and illness, she was no longer able to attend Mass in person. She died last week and will be greatly missed by her family and friends.

FR PAUL HACKETT RIP: Paul Hackett died peacefully in Preston on the morning of Tuesday 26th May. He was 96 years old, in the 80th year of religious life (he would have celebrated 80 years as a Jesuit on 7th September this year). Two of his brothers, Peter and Mark, also joined the Province. He was ordained in 1961 and took Final Vows in 1977. Much of the latter part of his apostolic ministry was spent working in parishes in Scotland: St Aloysius church in Glasgow, Stornoway, Oban, Lochgilphead, St Andrew's and as parish priest at Kingussie. His final move was to Preston in 2018. His funeral will be celebrated in St Wilfrid's, Preston, England on Tuesday 16th of June at 12.15pm

ARISAIG COMMUNITY COUNCIL: I received an email with concern from Arisaig Community Council regarding the condition of the slab and bench at the old graveyard. There is also an additional request to place a memorial bench. Hughie and Anne have already carried out some repair work at the graveyard, including steps and handrails. The Graveyard Committee no longer exists and maintaining the Old Graveyard has always been a role of the Community with Parish's assistance. Our Parishioners offered their time and support whenever they could for years. Unfortunately, as time goes by, this has declined but the Community Council has raised this concern so we must address it. If it is Parish ground and if we cannot make it secure, we might have to consider closing it entirely for the Public. Perhaps the matter requires greater involvement of the Community and Parish together? I am always extremely grateful for all the help and support we receive from volunteers, including cutting the grass. We will have an opportunity to discuss it at the next PC Meeting and respond to Arisaig Community Council.



FIRST COMMUNIONS: What a wonderful Corpus Christi Mass today with our youngsters receiving their First Communions at St. Mary's in Arisaig. They have a lovely understanding of what it means to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, truly present for us in the Eucharist. Afterwards we gathered for a lovely cuppa and baking. Thank you so much to Lilian Young for leading the catechesis. Many thanks to all our volunteers for their baking contributions, as well as proud parents and families of our young Communicants.

MASS INTENTIONS: I was asked why there are gaps in the Mass Intentions.

Every Mass has an intention, and the Priest does not always announce it. In our case there simply have not been any intentions provided. This is unfortunately a trend in smaller and bigger Parishes when people no longer feel the need to offer Masses for their friends, relatives etc. Church has always considered lack of intentions in the parish as one of the signs of inability of the community to sustain a resident priest. I do not think though that our situation is such and I am grateful to Fr Eagers, who always sends me some Mass Stipends in case we do not have enough.
